A Woman of Faith

“A place for meditation and reflection” is how Dollye Neal Ballenger described the purpose of the Dollye Neal Chapel. Since it opened in 2004, the Chapel has become a part of campus and community life.

“A woman of faith ... focused, determined, persistent; she knows exactly what she wants and why” — that is the way Midland College President David Daniel characterized **Benefactor Dollye Neal Ballenger when the Dollye Neal Chapel was dedicated Jan. 20, 2004** on the campus of Midland College.

Mrs. Ballenger intended the Chapel to be “a place apart” — for students, staff, faculty, friends and the community. As the setting for weddings, memorial services, meetings and a place where hundreds of Midlanders have engaged in private meditation and reflection, the Dollye Neal Chapel — a place apart — has become very much a part of campus and community life.

When Mrs. Ballenger died in early January, the Dollye Neal Chapel had already become a living tribute to her faith and her determination. The Chapel was the fulfillment of the vision she had in 2003, when she gave a gift to Midland College that funded the construction and continuing maintenance of the Dollye Neal Chapel at Midland College.

Funding the Chapel served a dual purpose for Mrs. Ballenger. **“Chapels have an endearment to me,”** Mrs. Ballenger said. Also, the Chapel honored her family. **She gave the Chapel as a gift in memory of her parents, Jewel and Ike Neal; her aunt, Roxie Neal; and her uncle, A.D. Neal.**

In May 2006, the design for the Dollye Neal Chapel received an Honor Award, the highest award given by the Lubbock Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. Parkhill, Smith and Cooper (PSC), architects for the Chapel, received the honor, which was awarded by a panel of three nationally distinguished architects who served as judges.

“I am astounded that a chapel on a college campus would receive this prestigious award. Most of all, I am so pleased for everyone who was involved in making the Chapel possible,” Mrs. Ballenger said when she learned of the award.

Mrs. Ballenger gave the money for the Chapel specifying that she did not intend the Chapel to promote any particular religious viewpoint or affiliation, and her gift covered the entire cost of construction. An additional gift to cover all maintenance costs insures that no money from Midland College’s operating budget was appropriated for the construction of the Chapel or will be appropriated for its ongoing maintenance.

Mrs. Ballenger also contributed to the following at Midland College: the Advanced Technology Center, the Fox Science Building, *Friends of the Series*, and the Doctor’s Day Scholarship.

Linda Cowden embraces family tradition by joining MC Foundation



The traditions of ranching and community service run strong in Linda Cowden's family. Cowden has embraced these traditions while putting her stamp on things. She is a fifth-generation rancher and a lifelong Midlander with a history of serving the community. Combining these two traditions, Cowden transitions easily from "pulling mesquite and shooting rattlesnakes" to leadership roles in the community. Two years ago, she served as chairwoman of the Citizens for Midland College Committee, which successfully campaigned to help pass MC's \$41.8 million bond. Now she is following in the footsteps of her late father, Frank Cowden, Jr., by joining the Midland College Foundation Board as its newest member. Frank Cowden, Jr. served on the Foundation Board from 1979-1985. Linda Cowden was appointed to the Foundation Board by the Midland College Board of Trustees in November 2006.

"I look forward to serving on the Midland College Foundation Board. Midland College has a big impact on the daily lives of Midland citizens, and this is one way I can give back to West Texas. The members of the Board are exceptional community leaders with strong ties to our community, and I am honored to join that group," she said, noting that she has known board member Spencer Beal and his family since elementary school in Midland.

Cowden attended Midland schools — Sam Houston Elementary, San Jacinto Junior High School and Midland High School — before attending Southern Methodist University and graduating from the University of Texas at Austin. She has served as vice-president of the Midland Junior League; fund-raising chairwoman of the George W. Bush Childhood Home, Inc.; and on the boards of United Way of Midland and the Museum of the Southwest. She co-chaired Midland's Centennial and Midland's celebration of the Texas Bi-Centennial with Chris Scharbauer in 1985 and 1986.

The **Slough Scholarship**, funded by the **Charles, Lela and Mary Slough Foundation** was established through Bank of America and administered by Midland College. The Slough Scholarship is a \$4 million perpetual grant program that helps students across the state attend college. Greathouse Trust joins Abell-Hanger to fund Students in Philanthropy

The **Helen Greathouse Charitable Trust** has joined the **Abell-Hanger Foundation** in helping to fund the **Midland College Students in Philanthropy (SIP) Club**. The gift was announced at the December Greathouse Grant Awards Ceremony. The MC

club was founded in 1997 by the **Abell-Hanger Foundation** and Midland College to provide student leaders the opportunity to improve the quality of life in their communities. Since its inception, more than **200 members of the SIP club** have reviewed **271 grant applications, resulting in 148 grants funded for a total of \$166,379**. A **\$100,000 gift** from the Greathouse Trust — with additional support from the **Abell-Hanger Foundation** and the **Chaparral Foundation** — also helps fund **Midland’s Legacy Scholarship.**

Perrys honor daughter's nursing career with endowed scholarship

As a nurse, **Dara Perry Bush** "touched a lot of lives," according to her parents, Midlanders Jackie and Wes Perry. To honor the memory of their daughter, who died in February 2006, the Perrys established **The Dara Perry Bush, RN Nursing Scholarship** at Midland College. The endowed scholarship is for **Associate Degree Nursing Students** who plan to pursue their Bachelor of Science in Nursing following graduation from Midland College.

Although Dara spent her nursing career in the Dallas-Ft. Worth area, the Perrys said they wanted a way to remember their daughter by doing "something local."

Dara graduated from Midland High School and took concurrent classes at Midland College. She completed her Bachelor's degree in Nursing at the University of Texas at Arlington as a single mom with a son. During her nursing career, she served at Bellaire Elementary School in Hurst, a Dallas/Ft. Worth suburb, as school nurse, and she had served as a medical missionary in Uganda. Working in primitive conditions at a clinic in Eastern

Uganda, she helped treat patients with a variety of medical conditions. She was most proud of constructing a make-shift catheter bag for a patient undergoing surgery.

After resuming her full-time job as a school nurse at an elementary school in the Dallas/Ft. Worth area, she dreamed of entering a Physicians Assistant program to train for a new medical career. She was learning Spanish so she could communicate better with her Hispanic patients. And, she hoped to make another trip to Uganda, where she had "found her calling."

In Uganda, and a year after Dara's death in Texas, more than 100 friends and colleagues held a special ceremony at the Ugandan clinic in her memory. Holding a picture of Dara in her favorite pink scrubs, one of her medical colleagues eulogized her while spreading her ashes outside the operating room of the clinic. "She loved kids, and she loved nursing," her parents said. "She was always smiling."

The Dara Perry Bush, RN Nursing Scholarship will pay for tuition, fees, and books by voucher, and scholarship recipients will be chosen by the MC Nursing faculty.

He was a member of the Midland College Foundation Board from 1977-1983.

Chaparral Center Expansion & Renovation Fund

room" for lecturers/performers; renovation of the Hospitality/Meeting Room, three offices, four public restrooms (including a family restroom), and three concession stands; lighting, sound and seating upgrades; air-conditioning, electrical and plumbing upgrades; upgraded dressing rooms; three new athletic dressing rooms; and landscaping, including an outdoor gathering space.
